SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION @ ST. MAX TIMELINE

FIRST PENANCE/FIRST COMMUNION

PHASE 1: Parent Orientation

Parents interested in beginning preparation for sacraments with their children take part in a session providing an overview to the process.

PHASE 2: Pre-Registration

All those who have participated in the orientation are invited to pre-register for sacramental preparation using an online process.

PHASE 3: Pastor Interview

After pre-registration, before the catechesis begins, families are invited to an interview with the pastor, usually 3-4 months prior to celebration. Interviews are scheduled using an online tool, and must be completed before the catechetical sessions begin.

PHASE 4: Catechetical Formation

After the pastor interview, as catechesis sessions begin, all who have completed phases 1-3 are invited to participate in the catechetical formation, comprised of parent sessions, parent/child sessions, and retreat. There is a catechetical formation period for First Penance and one for First Communion; they need not be done consecutively, but they certainly can be.

PHASE 5: Celebration

Children celebrate the Sacraments of First Penance and First Communion

PHASE 6: Mystagogy

Having celebrated God's love for us in the sacrament, the period of *mystagogy* ("exploring the mysteries") begins as children celebrate the sacraments frequently throughout their lives.

CONFIRMATION

PHASE 1: Parent Orientation

Parents interested in beginning preparation for sacraments with their children take part in a session providing an overview to the process.

PHASE 2: Pre-Registration

All those who have participated in the orientation are invited to pre-register for sacramental preparation using an online process.

PHASE 3: Catechetical Formation

All who have pre-registered are invited to participate in the catechetical formation, comprised of an opening event, sessions for candidates and sponsors, a retreat, and work at home on a portfolio.

PHASE 4: Pastor Interview

After catechesis, candidates interview with the pastor, to review their portfolio and talk about the family's journey of faith. Interviews are scheduled using an online tool, and must be completed before celebration can take place.

PHASE 5: Celebration

Candidates celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation.

PHASE 6: Mystagogy

Having celebrated God's love for us in the sacrament, the period of *mystagogy* ("exploring the mysteries") begins. The newly-confirmed participate in a mystagogy kickoff event, to reflect on their experience in the sacrament, and to talk about what this sacrament means for their continuing faith life.
