## A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

My dear brothers and sisters in our Lord Jesus Christ,

A continued blessed Christmastide to everyone as we celebrate this weekend the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. A happy and healthy New Year of 2018 to all as well!

Today the Church celebrates the great Solemnity of the Epiphany commemorating the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ to the whole world (represented by the Magi "from the East.") The Epiphany is a day of renewed joy at the birth of Jesus Christ and our acknowledgement of His divinity and saving grace which should then lead us to personal epiphanies accepting Christ as our Lord and Savior and pursuing lives of love, service and holiness.

As you departed Mass this weekend you received a magnet with "2018 special days" as a new year's gift from the parish. It is a long standing and venerable tradition to announce such days on the Epiphany through a sung proclamation – please accept the magnet in lieu of this. Of special note, at the top of the magnet is the "formula" **20 + C + M + B + 18** invoking the intercession the Magi as the new year begins. This inscription can be written in chalk on doorframes, especially the main entrance of a home or business. The letters C, M and B are not only the first letters of the names traditionally given to the Magi, i.e. Caspar, Melchoir and Balthazar, but also form an acronym for the Latin blessing prayer *Christus mansionem benedicat* translated *May Christ bless this house*. If your family has not observed this tradition in the past, perhaps this year might be an opportunity to start this pious practice of annually blessing your home.

This weekend marks the second anniversary of the **1% Challenge** here at St. Max, a commitment to spend 15 minutes a day (i.e. 1% of your day) praying with a scripture verse of your choice or one emailed to you daily. NB Signing-up for our daily **1% Challenge** email is easier than ever with our "text to sign up" feature: text "1percent" to 42828 and reply to the response with your email address. For those already participating, we invite you to share the **1% Challenge** with someone and find a **1% Challenge** partner to talk with once a month. For those who tried but did not continue the **1% Challenge** this year and for those who are new to the **1% Challenge** now, we invite you to "give it a try."

In the January 2018 edition of *The Modern Saint* you will read about two special weeks that are commemorated each January – National Migration Week and the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Additionally, each January 22 – the tragic anniversary of the Supreme Court decision legalizing abortion in our country – is marked as a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. Please be attentive to all the information and opportunities regarding these times of raised awareness and prayer.

As the Christmas season ends tomorrow on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord let me take this opportunity to say THANK YOU to all our liturgical ministers – greeters, altar attendants, sacristans, ushers, collectors, choristers, instrumentalists, cantors, lectors, gift-bearers, children's Liturgy of the Word leaders, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, art and environment team members (I hope I did not forget anyone!) – all of whom have made our Christmastide celebrations so grand and so glorious! Obviously, the several hundred parishioners and their ministry leaders who are involved in our liturgical ministries deserve our heartfelt appreciation week after week year round! They always seem to especially excel during our most solemn seasons and celebrations. So, again, THANK YOU to all our liturgical ministers for a great Christmastide!

## EVANGELIZATION & CATECHESIS

### GOSPEL FOR ALL AGES

Luke 2:16-21

In today's gospel, we learn that Mary honored her commitment to God by naming her child *Jesus*, the name given to Him by the angel Gabriel. In Matthew's gospel, Joseph is told to name the child *Jesus* because He will save the people. The name *Jesus* means "God saves." Even in His name, Jesus announces the mission He came to accomplish.

#### Family Faith Time

Your family might use today's feast as an opportunity to talk about names. Reflect together on the name of each member of the family. What does each name mean? Why was each person so named? Read together today's gospel, Luke 2:16-21. Recall that the name Jesus means "God saves." Think about how Jesus fulfilled the mission that His name suggests. Pray as a family that each family member will fulfill their mission to be faithful followers of Jesus, in whom we find our salvation. Pray for Mary's help by praying together the Hail Mary or singing together, "Sing of Mary, Pure and Lowly."
