A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

My dear brothers and sisters in our Lord Jesus Christ,

A continued blessed Christmastide to everyone as we celebrate this weekend the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. This annual feast presents the Holy Family to us as a model for Christian families. There is an Italian saying, *La famiglia é tutto*, which means *the family is everything*. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has made families one of the focal points of his papacy having supported synods and conferences on the family. Speaking to gathered families in 2015, the pope said, “You cannot have a family without dreams. I am very fond of dreams in families. For nine months, every mother and father dream about their baby. They dream about what kind of child he or she will be... You can’t have a family without dreams. Once a family loses the ability to dream, children do not grow, love does not grow, life shrivels up and dies. So I ask you each evening, when you make your examination of conscience, to also ask yourselves this question: Today did I dream about my children’s future? Today did I dream about the love of my husband, my wife? Did I dream about my parents and grandparents who have gone before me?” Some very poignant questions as we begin a new year.

All of today’s readings have to do with families and family life. The first reading from Sirach emphasizes the Fourth Commandment, “Honor thy father and mother.” We are commanded to respect and love our parents. However, it is a two way street. The Gospel speaks of the development of Jesus which should inspire parents to understand that our prayers are the same as the prayers of Joseph and Mary – that our children will become strong in spirit and filled with wisdom.

As you already know, next weekend, as we celebrate the Epiphany, we are encouraging each of you to live out your baptisms and be evangelizers – to be those who invite people not just to church but into a deeper relationship with Christ. If you don’t have your “Take One Step Closer” tool-kit there are copies by the doors to the parish office in the gathering space. One of the best summaries of the New Evangelization I have ever heard comes from Bishop John Doerfler of Marquette (the upper peninsula of Michigan) who was ordained and installed as bishop there almost four years ago. At the end of his ordination/installation Mass he set a pastoral vision for his diocese. He challenged those gathered with a threefold invitation:

- *Be a friend of Jesus* – first and foremost, we need a relationship with the Lord at center of our lives and we spend our lives nourishing, deepening and strengthening that relationship
- *Make a friend* – all of us have friends who have fallen away from an active and consistent practice of the Faith. Maybe we also “lapsed” at some time or another in our lives. We need to reconnect with past friends and always be open to making new friends.
- *Introduce your friend to Jesus* – this is what our “Take One Step Closer” initiative this Epiphany is basically all about. Through our baptism, we are each called to be evangelizers. Not a people who nag or drag, but a people who share stories and journey with others at their pace. So next weekend is an opportunity for you to re-introduce a past friend or perhaps introduce a new friend to Jesus. And this is just *taking one step closer* – the first of many, many steps we must all take to be closer to the Lord Jesus.

Our Eucharistic Holy Hour this week is a Holy Hour for Peace – so very appropriate as the World Day of Peace to begin the new year is commemorated annually on January 1. Peace is rather allusive sometimes – in our world and country, in our workplaces and neighborhoods, in our families and in our hearts. Join us this Thursday for our Holy Hour for Peace as we pray that the reign of the new-born Prince of Peace take root more and more and more in our time.

And finally, some words of gratitude. Thanks to everyone – from Fr. Simon Peter, Fr. Ron, our intern Nicholas White and me – for the many cards, gifts, goodies and holiday wishes extended to us at the rectory.

That’s it for now – God bless one and all!

EVANGELIZATION & CATECHESIS

GOSPEL FOR ALL AGES

Luke 2:22-40

Today's celebration of the Feast of the Holy Family highlights the importance of family in our religious life. We know that Mary and Joseph's faithfulness to God enabled them to cooperate in God's plan for our salvation by accepting the responsibility to raise God's Son, Jesus. From his parents, Jesus learned how to be a faithful believer in his Jewish tradition. Simeon's prophecy about Mary's sorrow alerts us to the importance of a family's commitment to one another, a commitment that is expressed in both good times and bad.

Family Faith Time

Gather as a family and recall times when your family showed its commitment to one another in good times and in bad. Can you recall times when your immediate family was supported by members of your extended family? Note that today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, and we see in the family of Jesus an example for our own family life. Read together today's gospel, Luke 2:22-40. Joseph and Mary expressed their faithfulness to God through their observance of the Law of Moses. Simeon prophesied the grief that Mary would experience at the foot of Jesus' cross. One of the blessings of family life is our commitment to one another, sharing good times, and supporting one another through difficult times. Write a prayer together, thanking God for your family life and asking God to strengthen your family's commitment to one another.
