A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

My dear brothers and sisters in our Lord Jesus Christ,

Today we celebrate our patronal solemnity and, as we have done for the past several years, we transfer its celebration to the Sunday nearest its actual annual August 14 commemoration so as to allow the entire parish to celebrate it well. Having traveled to Poland last October to commemorate the 75th anniversary of our patron saint's martyrdom, I really cannot express in words how profound an affect being at Auschwitz and seeing the actual cell where Fr. Maximilian Kolbe died has had on me. Perhaps the best way I can describe it is that it is persistently spiritually haunting.

As has also become our annual custom as we celebrate our patron saint, we recognize and thank all of our volunteers today. We could not be the amazing parish that we are without such amazing and dedicated volunteers! Whether one serves in an “ongoing, regular” volunteer capacity or serves as a volunteer to fulfill an occasional need, each and every one of our volunteers plays an important role in making St. Max what it is – so thank you, thank you, thank you! As you see in the bulletin, throughout the year we have a monthly Sunday Mass intention for our various volunteers – so in addition to our consistent gratitude, we also offer unceasing prayer for our volunteers.

All that being said, I know from talking to parishioners that some *don't volunteer* for any parish group because they think we have enough volunteers. Don't be fooled by the size of our parish or the many ministries, activities and organizations we have – ***we are always in need of more volunteers!*** As we practice authentic discipleship and purposeful stewardship, we must acknowledge the gifts and talents of everyone, and we must also insure that everyone has the opportunity to use their gifts and talents. This is why we have “term limits” for some volunteers – not because they are not doing a good job or are not qualified, but because we must allow everyone to have the opportunity to share their gifts and talents with the community. And, to be honest, we as a parish need to care for each other and help each other avoid “burn out” so a regular turnover in volunteers in one parish group is beneficial. It is also beneficial that volunteers switch parish groups every so often since new eyes and new ideas are always refreshing and needed for growth and success in our parish groups.

This Tuesday, August 15, is the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a holy day of obligation. Masses here are at 6:30 & 8:30 AM and at 7:30 PM. And, as has been our custom for the past several years, we will have a rosary procession and crown the outdoor statue of Mary after our evening Mass. Thanks to the Knights of Columbus who will be with us Tuesday night for the Mass, procession and crowning and who are hosting an ice cream social to cap-off the evening.

For those who may need a noontime Mass time to fit into your work schedule on the holy day, you might try going to www.masstimes.org to find a church near your place of employment with a midday holy day Mass. But... PLEASE CALL THEM AHEAD! With fewer active priests and many priests pastoring more than one parish in a pastoral region, Mass times have been changing in many places. So, call ahead to make sure the online information is correct before driving to a nearby church for a midday holyday Mass.

Let us continue to keep summer travelers in our prayers that they might all reach their destinations and return home safely.

Celebrating our Patron, Celebrating our Parish


In the annual calendar of liturgical celebrations, there are several important days particular to any given parish. These days hold the liturgical rank of solemnity (the highest rank given to days in the liturgical calendar, ranked above feasts and memorials) and can be celebrated either on the day itself, or replace the nearest Sunday in Ordinary Time. The celebration of such local solemnities expresses the significance of the parish community, and its unique place in the local Church (the diocese) and the Church universal. These days are important annual celebrations for any parish and should be marked with solemnity and joy.

One such day is the anniversary of the dedication of the church building. Since our church was dedicated on Dec 23rd, here at St. Max we take the Church's "alternate option" and celebrate this on the last Sunday before All Saints Day. While the Church is first and foremost about God's holy people, church buildings are an important expression of the marvelous works of God and are houses of grace where the Holy Trinity is worshiped and adored.

Perhaps more significant, though, is the feast day of our patron saint, Maximilian Kolbe, August 14th. Each parish is entrusted to a patron saint, whose charisms and identity we strive to embody, and whose life of faith we remember and celebrate. We celebrate our patronal feast day each year on the Sunday nearest to August 14th, replacing a Sunday in Ordinary Time.

We use prayers and readings assigned to the feast of Maximilian Kolbe, but we also use incense, more orchestral instruments, choirs, and as much other festivity as we can muster for this important community celebration. We appreciate our many volunteers who serve the parish throughout the year. We also commission and ask God's blessing upon our new commission and council members, whose term is just beginning.

At all the Masses this weekend, we'll sing the hymn specially commissioned for our parish's 25th anniversary a few years ago. As we prepare for this celebration, I invite you to reflect upon these beautiful words, written especially for our parish, and pray that our parish community will continue to follow Christ imitating our great patron!



Faithful God, we sing your praises; hear our grateful hymn this day. With your steadfast love you guide us on the everlasting way. You have led us on our journey, blessed your people year by year. Like Saint Maximilian Kolbe, may we serve and persevere.

Christ, you call us as disciples; name us as your chosen friends. By your death and resurrection, you give life that never ends. May we follow your example, as we serve a world in need, laying down our lives for others, loving all in truth and deed.

Holy Spirit, come renew us, burn within our faithful hearts. Help us witness to your power as one body, many parts. Give us strength to spread the Gospel, even in adversity. Firm in faith, we work for justice, moved by hope and charity.

Church of God, with songs of gladness, magnify the Three in One. Offer thanks for countless blessings, mindful of what God has done: Lifting up the poor and lowly, helping all who are in pain. May we go to serve God's people, bearing fruit that will remain.

GOSPEL FOR ALL AGES

Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary-August 15

Luke 1:39-55

On Tuesday the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary - A holy day of obligation. The feast celebrates the dormition (or “falling asleep”) of Mary and her bodily assumption into heaven, before her body could begin to decay. This feast foretells our own bodily resurrection, and has been celebrated since the sixth century. In the gospel we will hear, that Mary “set out and traveled to the hill country in haste” to visit her cousin Elizabeth. Mary wanted to share her good news with her cousin. Elizabeth, with the Holy Spirit’s help, welcomed Mary and felt her own baby move at the same time. Realizing how blessed she was by God Mary proclaimed a poem that we still sing and recite. Her *Magnificat* sings praise for the goodness of God and the fulfillment of the promise that God made to Abraham. Conversation starter: What would you say to Mary if she visited you? What do you think Mary would say to you?



Living the Word

An old folk custom associates the feast day of the Assumption with water. Plan to participate in either the 6:30 AM, 8:30 AM or 7:30 PM Mass with your family, and then spend the rest of the day at the lake or your local swimming pool. Play some water balloon games if you want to stick close to home. Use the hose or a sprinkler if weather permits. If school is already in session, make time next weekend for some end-of-summer water play. Spending some time as family on this great Marian feast day is a wonderful way to honor the Mother of the Lord, Queen of Heaven and Earth.
