





The Fraction of the Bread

 (who take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.)

After the final invocation, the assembly responds:
“qui tollis peccata mundi, dona nobis pacem.”
 (who take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.)

After the Communion Procession and music concludes, all sit for a period of silent prayer. Then, all stand and sing together a song of praise.






Antiphon (*Choir, then all repeat*)





He then greets the people in the usual way, to which all respond:




Penitential Act
