A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

My dear brothers and sisters in our Lord Jesus Christ,

CHRISTMAS MASSES – AN INVITATION TO YOU AND FROM YOU! As I shared with you last week, as we look ahead to our Christmas Masses where crowds swell with many guests and visitors present, we need to remember that hospitality to guests and visitors is *everyone's responsibility* – in the building and in the parking lot! In today's gospel John the Baptist extends an invitation for us to encounter God anew through our repentance, through our change of heart. As we hear God's invitation extended to us, we are called and missioned by our baptism to extend God's invitation to others. Thus, this week as we zero-in on the dynamic of *inviting*, all are encouraged to take one of the postcards at the ends of the pews (these will be available next week, too!), write a short personal note on it and give it so someone *inviting* them to join us for Mass on Christmas. That being said, as your schedule allows I would also ask everyone's consideration to attend Midnight Mass or a Mass on Christmas Day. Why? Because our Christmas Eve Masses are very, very full! We want everyone to have the best possible Christmas experience here – and evening out our crowds (i.e. more people coming to Midnight Mass and Masses on Christmas morning) will go a long way accomplishing that aspiration. Please give serious consideration to this request – and thanks to all who have already changed their Christmas Mass times the past few years to achieve this better balance. (And of special note, as you see on the postcard and in our December email to the parish, we will use our normal Christmas Mass schedule even though Christmas is on a Sunday, meaning there is no 8:00 AM Mass on Sunday, December 25.) Next week we will zero-in on the dynamic of *welcoming*.

On this Second Sunday of Advent, in St. Paul's epistle to the Romans he writes, *“May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to think in harmony with one another.”* Paul recognizes and knows that it is only through God – through the Holy Spirit – that each of us can truly find that internal conversion to have endurance and patience to achieve the harmony for which we seek. Isn't that part of what we are striving for during this Advent season? In the midst of the secular hurriedness for preparing for Christmas our patience may not be what it ought to be! Maybe we even think God is working too slowly for us, if He is working at all. (He is always with us of course!) *God's plan for us* is often based upon *our* patience and endurance. How often do we get confused and think *our plan for us* should include God's quick attentiveness to our every thought and whim as if we know what is better for ourselves than God Himself does? As text of the popular Advent song from many years ago reminds us, *patience, people, till the Lord is come*.

This Thursday, December 8, is the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, our national patroness and a holyday of obligation. Masses are at 6:30 & 8:30 AM and 7:30 PM.

Looking ahead, our second Advent communal penance service is next Tuesday evening, December 13 at 7:00 PM. And, in addition to our four normal scheduled times for individual confessions each week, we will extend the Saturday morning time to 12:00 PM on December 17 and we will have additional times on Monday, December 19 from 4:00-6:00 PM and 7:00-9:00 PM with three confessors available. A list of all individual confession times and a schedule of all communal penance services in the deanery was in last week's bulletin and is on our website. Everyone is strongly encouraged to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance before Christmas.

And again, THANKS to everyone for your wonderful response to our annual stewardship renewal. Your willingness to spend time in prayer, to share talents through volunteering and to give treasure in financial support of the parish is amazingly generous and inspiring. Please remember to return your commitment card as soon as soon as possible if you have not already done so.

That's all for now – God bless one and all!

WORSHIP

ADVENT VIOLET

One of the most obvious elements of our liturgical celebration of Advent is the use of the color violet. One of the four principal liturgical colors (along with red, green, and white), it is the proper color for Advent, Lent, and the Sacrament of Penance. Throughout history, purple has been the color of the nobility and of royalty. We use it to represent our belief in Christ who is King of all creation. While Advent and Lent are both seasons of preparation, they are certainly not the same in focus. While Lent has a baptismal and penitential character, Advent is more focused on preparing for Christ's coming – both in the Incarnation, and at the end of time. To help distinguish between the two seasons, we tend to use a “bluer” purple during Advent, and a “reddish” purple during Lent.



WAIT FOR THE LORD...WITH THE LORD - EXPOSITION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Join us on the Mondays of Advent (December 5, 12, 19) after the 8:30 AM Mass until 5:00 PM for Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the chapel.

Just as we do each Thursday, this liturgy gathers the Church in community to give thanks for the great gift of Christ present in the Eucharist. Including extended periods of silent prayer and punctuated by scripture and prayer, Exposition is a great way to pray for the coming of Christ this Advent.

Because Exposition is a communal liturgy, we need to ensure that all the hours are covered. If you can commit to an hour on each Monday, or even just one Monday, please sign up using the link on the parish website, or e-mail adoration@saint-max.org with questions or to get signed up.

As we pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, let us “wait for the Lord whose day is near!”

GOSPEL FOR ALL AGES

Matthew 3:1-6

John the Baptist said that people should repent and change their lives, becoming like a brand new person inside. John the Baptist shows that baptism with water is like making yourself clean on the inside. Through the Sacrament of Baptism we understand that we *have* and *need* God's forgiveness.

Signing ourselves with holy water as we enter the church reminds us of our baptism. Everyone's baptismal day is as important as a birthday. If your kids don't know the date of their baptism, tell them... Pull out the scrap book and show them what a glorious day this was! Post all the baptismal dates of your family members in a prominent place. Decide together how you can celebrate those days during the year. One way to celebrate is to let the baptismal day person pick one special thing to eat for dinner. We receive the perfect gift from God through the Sacrament of Baptism: a reward in Heaven.

RETRouvaille-A LIFELINE FOR MARRIED COUPLES



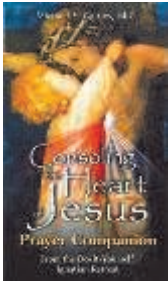
