Saint Faustina's "Divine Mercy Sundae"

- Big scoop of your favorite ice cream
- GIANT bowl
- whipped cream
- blue and red sprinkles
- cherry on top



Put a divine mercy-sized scoop of ice cream into the bowl, then spray 2 streaks of whipped cream on the ice cream in the shape of an upside down "V." Then, add blue sprinkles to the right side whipped cream, and on the left side sprinkle the red. Add the cherry on top and you've made a sundae the saints would eat!
